### **HOW TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES FOR FALL 2013**

- 1. Login in myGate with your user name (example: jdoe1) and password (example elizabeth20\*).
- 2. Click on the Academic tab.
- 3. Under the box called **Registration Tools**, click on **Add or Drop Classes**.
- 4. Select the Fall 2013 term.
- 5. Type in the "CRNS" (five digit numbers starting with an 8) in the boxes provided.\*
- 6. Click on Submit Changes.
- 7. If you see a red dot with an X in it, ask one of the workers for help.
- 8. To see your schedule, click **Go back to the Academics tab** at the top of the screen.
- 9. Under the box called Student Links, click View/Print My Schedule, select Fall 2013, click submit.

\*If you do **not** have the CRNS, go back to your Academics tab. In the Registration Tools box, click **Look Up Classes**. Select the Fall 2013 term. Select the subject (example: ENG for English), and type in the course number (example: 105) if you know it. If not, you can search by subject only. Click **Class Search**. Select the section of the class you want that is open/available (available classes have an open box in the select column). Write down the CRN. Do this for each class that you want. When you have the last one, click **Register** at the bottom of the search screen. You are now ready for Step 5.

### **TESTING INFORMATION**

### College/AP/CLEP credit

Students who have attended any other college must have official college transcripts mailed directly to the MSU Undergraduate Admissions office from the Registrar's Office of each college attended. **These transcripts are required even if a student withdrew or does not want the credit transferred.** Students who have testing credit from CLEP and/or AP must have official score reports mailed directly to MSU Undergraduate Admissions from the testing service. Their address is: Murray State University, Office of Undergraduate Admissions, 102 Curris Center, Murray, KY 42071.

Students may not CLEP out of ENG 105, however, they can get CLEP credit for ENG 101 which can count as an elective. For the AP English Language and Composition test, a 4 or 5 score awards credit for ENG 105. A score of 3 awards credit for ENG 101, but the student must still take ENG 105. For the AP English Literature and Composition test, a score of 3 or 4 awards 3 credits for ENG 201, and a score of 5 awards 6 credits of ENG 201.

### **Mandatory Developmental Courses**

- ENGLISH Students admitted with restrictions must first enroll in ENG 095. All students with an English ACT score below 18 **must** enroll in ENG 100. All students with an SAT writing portion below 450 **must** enroll in ENG 100.
- MATH All students with a math ACT score below 19 **must** enroll in MAT 100. All students with a SAT math portion below 460 **must** enroll in MAT 096. MAT 097 is still strongly recommended for students with a math ACT score of 19 or a SAT score between 460 490.
- READING Students admitted with restrictions **must** first enroll in REA 095. All students with a reading ACT score below 20 **must** enroll in REA 100 and REA 120. All students with an SAT critical reading portion below 480 **must** take REA 100 and REA 120.

### **Testing Results**

The results from the developmental course assessment or residual ACT (if available) will be given to your Summer O counselor. They will give them to you shortly before the session with your academic advisor.

### Information for Students Currently Enrolled in AP Classes and other classes that may yield college credit

AP classes and a range of dual-credit courses may give incoming students credit for courses in which many first-year and transfer students enroll. Scores and grades must be reported to the university before they are processed for Murray State University credit.

AP Credit for Murray State University courses is generated based on grades on AP exams. If you have taken AP exams and have had your scores submitted to Murray State, your AP credit will appear on your Degree Audit Report, with the course # and credit awarded. Other college credit, once reported, will be reflected on the Degree Audit Report once appropriate documentation has been submitted. **Send all official college transcripts and AP exam score results from the college or testing agency directly to Undergraduate Admissions, 102 Curris Center, Murray, KY 42071.** 

Until AP scores and other course credits are processed, students MUST register for courses based on the information currently in hand. That said, once AP scores and/or other credits are processed, students may need to adjust their schedules. Once new credits are granted, follow the advisor-provided instructions below.
