## Errata Last update: July 26 2013

### Section 4.7

The book incorrectly states how external commands can be run while bypassing PowerShell parsing. A correct example is this:

```
H:\backup\scripts\sbrun.exe"--% -mdn ( sbvol -f  
\\?\GLOBALROOT\Device\HarddiskVolumeShadowCopy43 \\?\E: : sbcrypt -50 :  
sbfile -wd H:\backup\backups )
```

Here, sbrun.exe is being run – and it appears first on the command line. The --% operator tells PowerShell to stop parsing the remainder of the line and to instead pass it along as-is.

### Page 160

The reference to Get-Command, in the section on parentheses, should refer to Get-Content, which was used in the first part of the example.
