## PAYMENT OF FEES

Fall 2009 and Spring 2010

Effective fall 2009 – All MSU billing statements will be sent electronically. An Email will be sent to your [murraystate.edu](mailto:murraystate.edu) account notifying the student that their statement is available for viewing through their MyGate account under the Money Tab. eBill is a real-time billing system that is fully integrated with the university student information systems. Students view their most recent statement; students will see all account activity posted to their accounts since the last statement was prepared and make payments on the most up-to-date account balances calculated at the instant they view their account or statement.

Students are expected to establish a payment arrangement for the 2009-2010 academic year and all future continuous semesters of attendance at Murray State University. Payment arrangements must be made with the Office of the Bursar.

Acceptable payment arrangements consist of the following:

- Payment in full of all tuition, fees, room and board or a given term
- Enrollment in the Murray State University payment plan with required initial payment. (Application is available through the student myGate account.)

All of the above payment options are due by noon on the due date shown on the semester billing statement. Payments may be made by mail, or in person (Cash, check or debt card) at the Cashier's Office, 2nd-Floor Lobby in Sparks Hall. Checks presented for payment will be converted to a POP or ARC and processed as an ACH payment. Payments may also be made online through the student's myGate account. Acceptable payment methods are: E-check and pinless debt card. If you choose to pay by credit card (MasterCard, Discover and American Express accepted), the payment processor will assess a 2.75% of transaction amount or a \$3 minimum convenience fee.

Students from these five counties will be treated as Kentucky students in relation to admissions requirement and housing, and dining policies.

## Regional Tuition

(Residents of Illinois, Indiana, Missouri and Tennessee, admitted from Summer 2001 and thereafter, will be charged out-of-state tuition and given a tuition discount to adjust their tuition charge to the appropriate amount below. In order to receive the Regional Tuition Discount, undergraduates must enroll full-time and pay for university housing. Seniors with full-time status are allowed to receive the discount and not live in university housing. Graduates need not meet these requirements to receive the discount.)

## REFUND SCHEDULE

**WITHDRAWAL:** A student who completes official withdrawal (written clearance through the Registration and Bursar's offices constitutes completion) or is dismissed within the first 25% of the semester will receive a refund of tuition, fees, room and board in accordance with the calendar below. Students residing in Murray State residential colleges will receive housing refunds only in the event of withdrawal from school, dismissal or marriage.

**DROP:** A student dropping a class will receive a refund of tuition and/or course fee if the student (1) drops below full-time, (2) is part-time and drops a class(es), or (3) is full-time and drops a class with refundable course fee. Refunds will be in accordance with the calendar below.

## ROOM AND BOARD – 2009-2010

Freshman and sophomore students who are not exempt from housing regulations by virtue of age, military service, or other approved exemptions, must reside in university housing during the regular semesters. Anyone with fewer than 30 semester hours earned is classified as a freshman. Anyone with at least 30 hours but fewer than 60 semester hours earned is classified as a sophomore. Exemptions to this requirement must be obtained *in writing* and *in advance* of registration from the Housing Office. **(Undergraduates, with the exception of seniors, who qualify for and accept the Regional tuition discount for out-of-state students are required to pay**

for university housing.) All room rent is due at the beginning of the semester. Questions should be directed to the Housing Office staff at (270) 809-2310.

Students may elect to place money into Declining Balance. The Declining Balance may be used at any food service location, Copy Express or the University Store. Freshman and sophomore students may use declining balance in addition to their **required** meal plan purchase. Dollars may be carried over from one semester to the next. Refunds for Declining Balance are also available during the last two weeks of the semester or when the student leaves the university as long as the ending balance is \$10 or more.
