Graduates responding to surveys conducted by all Kentucky universities rank MSU very favorable in critical measures of quality.

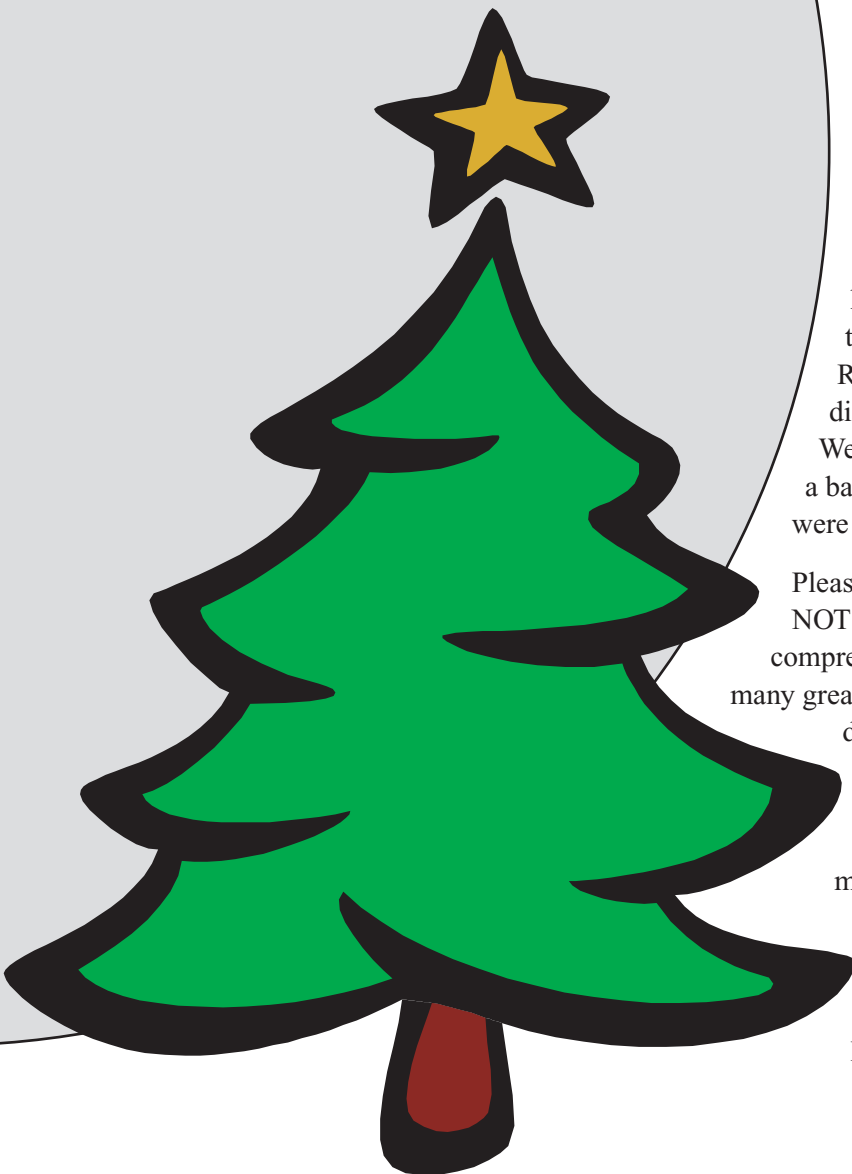

Please keep in mind that these nominations were NOT scientifically gathered and are certainly not comprehensive. Many students never saw the form and thus many great faculty are not represented. It says a lot about our faculty—and a lot about our students.

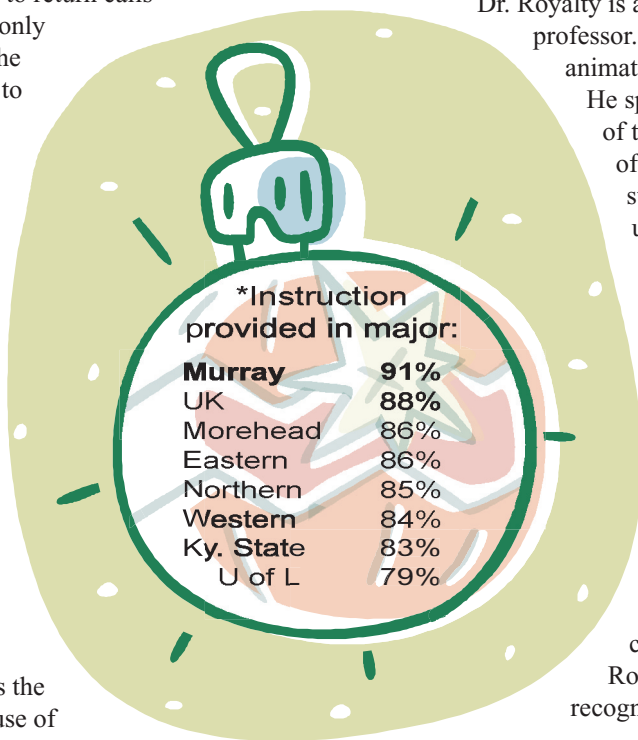
**James Galt-Brown**

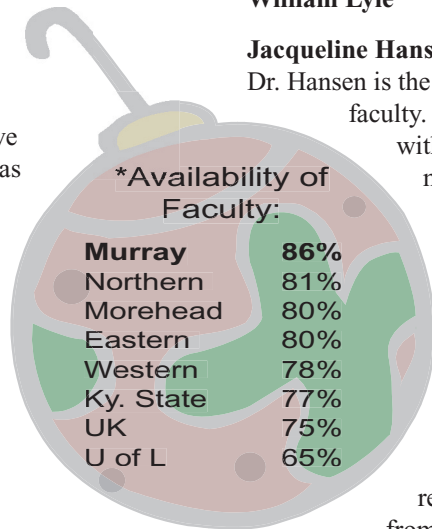

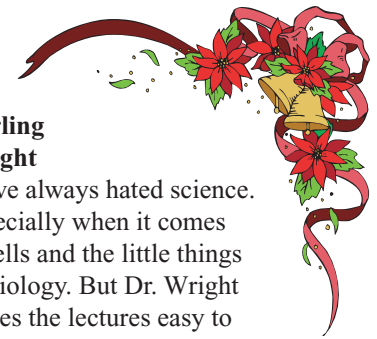

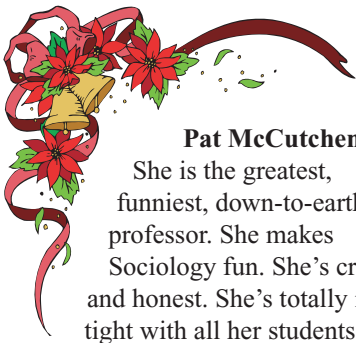
**John Fannin**

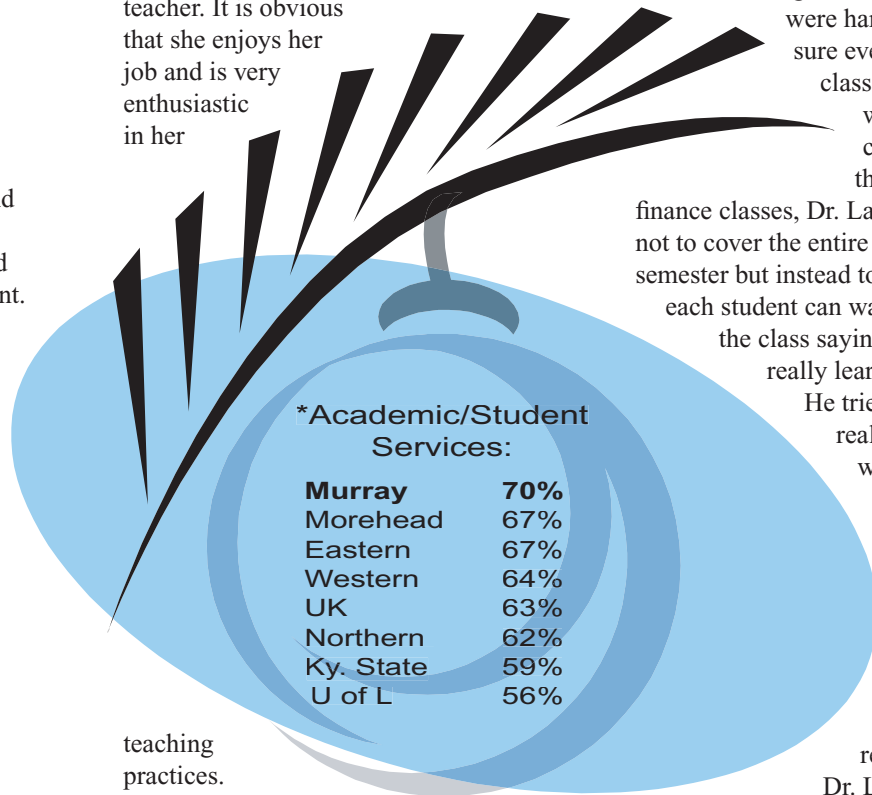

Danny has always gone above and beyond what is required of him as a teacher. He genuinely cares about the concerns, as well as the joys, of his students. He is without a

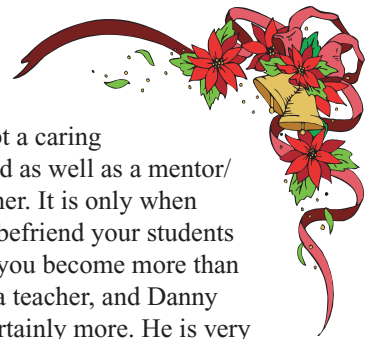
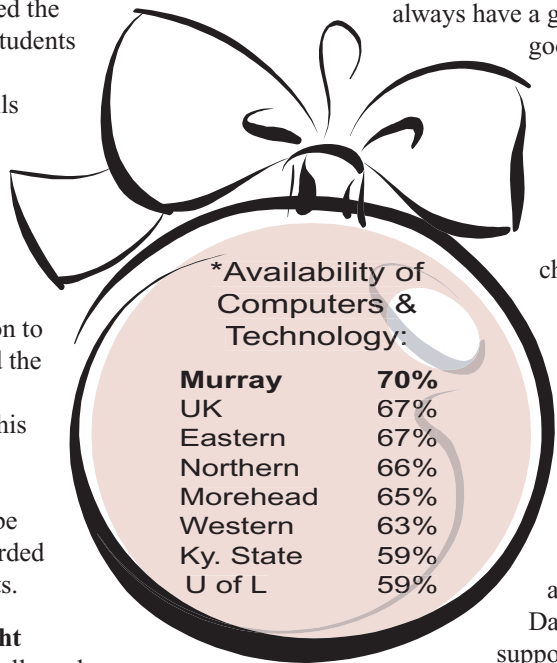

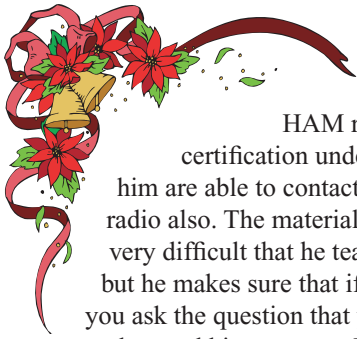
**Betty Driver**

I feel Dr. Jones does an exceptional job at making the students think for themselves. His classroom style is unique and challenging. He also keeps his material current and up to

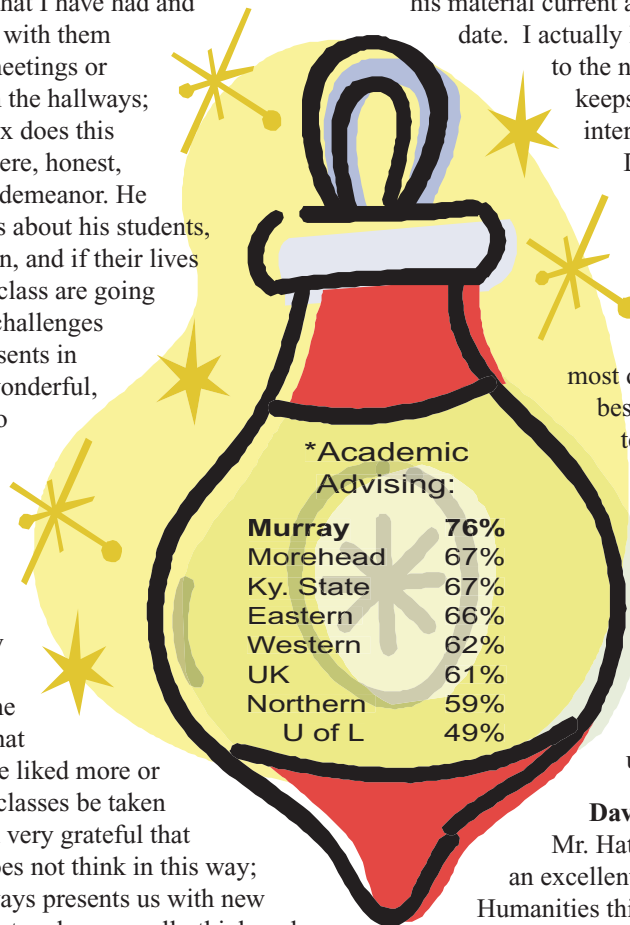
date. I actually look forward to the next class, he keeps things interesting. I think Dr. Jones should be recognized as a great MSU instructor.

**Bommanna Loganathan**

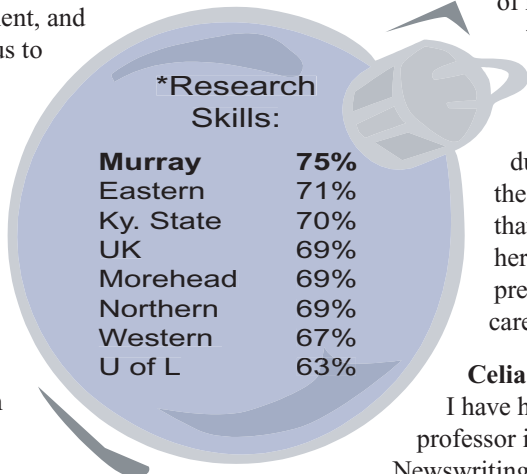

**Celia Wall**

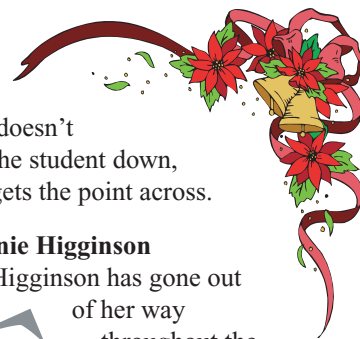

**Sterling Wright**

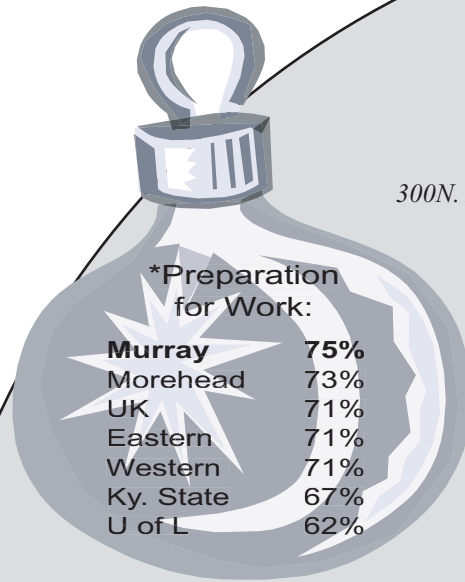
Mr. Wright is a very caring and considerate teacher who
