

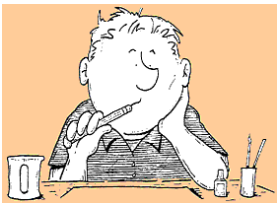

Professional Development Training

Analytical Writing: Leading students to higher order thinking through analysis writing.

Reflective Writing: Developing metacognition skills as students reflect through writing.

On-demand Writing: Leading all teachers to use on-demand for content assessment.

Reading/Writing Connection: 1.) Using literacy strategies to bridge and develop both reading and writing skills 2.) Reading like a writer.

Designing Units: Increasing learning in the classroom through carefully designed instruction that both spirals and scaffolds for retention leading to transfer of knowledge.

Motivating the Reluctant Writer: Encouraging those students who would rather be dipped in hot oil than have to write.

Writing to Learn: Coaching students to be active learners through writing

Writing in Verse: 1.) Using familiar items to encourage poetry 2.) Analyzing poetry 3.) Motivating poetry with music and visuals.

Integrating Grammar in the Writing Classroom: Leading students to understand the practical applications of using correct grammar through the use of student writings.

Writing Strategies that Work in the Elementary Classroom: Using ideas tested by teachers to improve writing.

Using Picture Books to Motivate Writing: Introducing genres using picture books (all grade levels).

Developing Characters in Writing Fiction: Developing believable characters that the reader can see.

Technical Writing in High School: Leading secondary students to write for real world audiences using real world methods.

Transactive Writing in Middle School: Raising the standards for transactive writing by leading students to use a variety of modes.

Elementary Inquiry: Facilitating learning through carefully planned, student-led learning.

Writing in Math/Writing in Social Studies/Writing in the Sciences: 1.) Using writing to learn, writing to demonstrate learning, and real world writing in all subjects. 2.) Developing prompts in content area writing.

Writing in Primary: Allowing primary students to use their creativity in writing

Tuning Protocol: For on-demand and/or open-response question.

Publishing: Where can I publish student work? What other ideas for publishing can I use with my students?
