National Registry for Undergraduate Researchers

The Council on Undergraduate Research (CUR) has created a national registry for undergraduate researchers. Students performing research and scholarly activity in the following disciplines are eligible to register free of charge: Chemistry, Biochemistry, Biology, Physics/Astronomy, Mathematics/Computer Science, Economics, Geosciences, Engineering, Psychology, Sociology, Humanities and Anthropology/Archaeology.

The registry will serve to match individuals and graduate schools seeking high quality students who are well-prepared to continue their research. Interested individuals should visit www.cur.org/ugreg/ and complete the simple curriculum vitae form. CUR states, "Organizations or companies seeking the students' information for other marketing purposes will not be granted access."

"This is a great opportunity for undergraduate students performing research or scholarly activity outside the classroom to get their work in front of graduate schools across the country," said Dr. Bonnie Higginson, Associate Provost for Academic Programs. "Admission to graduate school is often challenging and competitive. Students in the registry's eligible fields should take full advantage of this opportunity to showcase their undergraduate accomplishments."
